

ABOUT THE ALAMO COLLEGES


- 5 Colleges- each individually accredited
- 60,000 student enrollment each semester
- 5 HSI/ 1 HBCU
- M/F ratio: 43% / 57%
- FT/PT ratio: 19% / 81%
- Ethnicity:
 - White (24%); African-American (8%), Hispanic (62%); Other (6%)
- Avg. Age: 23.0 years
- Dual Credit enrollment: 20%
- 16 Early College High Schools

CHALLENGE

- 80% of entering students at Alamo Colleges indicate they wish to transfer
- Fall 2010 FTIC cohort 4-yr. Graduation Rates:
 - FT 14.7% / PT 9.5%
 - VLCC Avg: 16.3%
 - State Avg: 17.9%
- 6-yr. FTIC by 2014 Transfer Rate:
 - 21.0%
 - VLCC Avg: 24.7%
 - State Avg: 25%
- Avg SCH to associate degree: 92
- Not all courses earned count toward the student's degree at university of choice
- Many have to take unexpected additional courses toward degree
- Time spent to complete Associates Degree: 4.6 yrs.
- Amassed debt of \$18,000*
- Only 1.5 years PELL remaining





