26 years old and wants to be a nurse Tested at ABE level Living in poverty with 2 part time jobs Single mother of two small children In an abusive relationship Food insecurity Unreliable transportation

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Margo's Reality!

Factors that may contribute to me leaving school:

College was not what I thought it would be.

I never was good at school, so why would I expect to be now?

I have no idea what courses to take.

Everyone at home thinks this is a "stupid" idea.

Ways to help change this:

Relevant materials (contextualized) Small success steps Visualizing the end goal Opportunity for counseling, personal attention, flexible scheduling

Students need intentional guides to successful completion




