Tackling Transfer is a national initiative that fosters the conditions for scalable and measurable improvements in equitable bachelor's degree attainment rates for students who begin at community college.



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

Institute Learning Objectives

- Understand the importance of connecting pathways to transfer and baccalaureate completion, including the implications for equity in outcomes
- Examine research-based strategies for improving transfer outcomes and outcomes for students in transition
- Reflect on institutional practice through discussion of research-based practices to advance outcomes for transfer students and students in transition
- Identify key measures for tracking transfer outcomes and assess root cause for transfer outcomes by evaluating these data in relation to institutional practice

Scale of Adoption Self-Assessment Additions

- Programs are organized and marketed in broad career-focused academic and communities or "meta-majors."
- Special supports are provided to help academically underprepared students to succeed in the program-relevant "gateway" **math** courses by the end of their first year.
- Special supports are provided to help academically underprepared students to succeed in the "gateway" **English** courses by the end of their first year.
- Instruction across programs (especially in program introductory courses) engages students in active and applied learning, encouraging them to think critically, solve meaningful problems, and work and communicate effectively with others.



TRUE Credential

- Can be completed in less than 6 months
- Can be completed through non-credit workforce continuing education courses, credit career technical education courses, or a combination of non-credit and credit courses
- Is tied to an occupation with starting pay of at least \$26,380
- Is relatively low-cost for students (program costs \$3,000 or less to complete)



Inventory of TRUE Credentials

- Organized by industry
- Data requested
 - Name of program
 - Supported by employer beyond traditional advisory committees yes/no
 - Type of courses credit, non-credit, or both
 - Stacked with credentials that apply credit toward another credential, certificate, and degree program in a career pathway yes/no
 - Training costs per student
 - Starting wage for associated occupation
