Introduction

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Context

Mason

- Total Enrollment: 37,677
 Undergraduate: 25,508
- Over 3,000 new transfer undergraduates per year
- 45% of undergrad pop. is transfer
- 90% of VCCS transfers are from NOVA

In VA, articulation agreements are independent

NOVA

- NOVA Total Undergraduate Enrollment: 71,837
- Over 60% of NOVA transfers go to Mason

Definitions

- Pathway document
 - Four* year, dual degree-completion plan
 - Included in "agreement" students sign when entering program
 - Updated every year; agreement year functions like catalog year
- Co-enrollment
 - Courses taken at Mason while degree-seeking at NOVA
 - About half of the pathways have either optional or required coenrollment

ADVANCE Program Milestones

- 1. Students must take SDV 100 or SDV 101 in the first semester at NOVA.
- 2. Students must begin Developmental coursework in the first semester in ADVANCE at NOVA.
- 3. Students must take first college-level MTH course and ENG 111 in the semester immediately following the completion of any MTT or ENF courses (excluding summer).
- 4. In the first 30 credits, students must:
 - a. Complete ENG 111 and ENG 112 with a C or better.
 - b. Complete the first college-level MTH course with a C or better.
- 5. Students must complete at least six degree-applicable credits with a C or better each fall and spring semester.
- 6. Students must maintain a 2.5 cumulative GPA.
- 7. Students must apply for NOVA graduation and complete their Associate's degree.



Overview: Pathway Numbers

- Total Pathway documents by catalog year
 - 18-19: 21
 - 19-20: 102
 - 20-21: 95
 - 21-22: 80
 - Reduction generally from consolidating pathway documents built by major concentration into one document

Maintenance Steps: Lifecycle Process

ADVANCE Pathway Review Process Timeline	Deadline	
Faculty Summit	Mid-October	
Faculty Summit revisions applied Pathways sent to NOVA faculty/Pathway Council	Mid-November	
NOVA Pathway Councils return with feedback/approval	End of January	
Pathways sent to Mason faculty with revisions/questions	Mid-February	
Mason Faculty return with feedback /approval	Mid-March	
Mason Catalog Published (NOVA's is earlier)	April 1	
Feedback reconciled and final formatting applied Final review and revision by Academic Affairs staff	Mid-April	
Pathways published to web and loaded to declaration	May 1	

Pathway Lifecycle: Faculty Summit

- Mid-October strategic in catalog cycle
- Opportunity for NOVA and Mason faculty to discuss:
 - Issues and opportunities for engagement
 - Curriculum updates, course transferability
 - Patterns in students' experience/success
 - Build trust, cultivate relationships
- Provided: draft pathway(s), a review checklist, and a facilitator/note taker.

Lessons Learned

- Project management is key; significant time investment
- Must have clear guidelines for pathway development and specific timeline for changes
- Document clarity requires considerable refinement
- Faculty engagement = collaboration and troubleshooting
- Student feedback:
 - Pathway document
 - Success Coach
