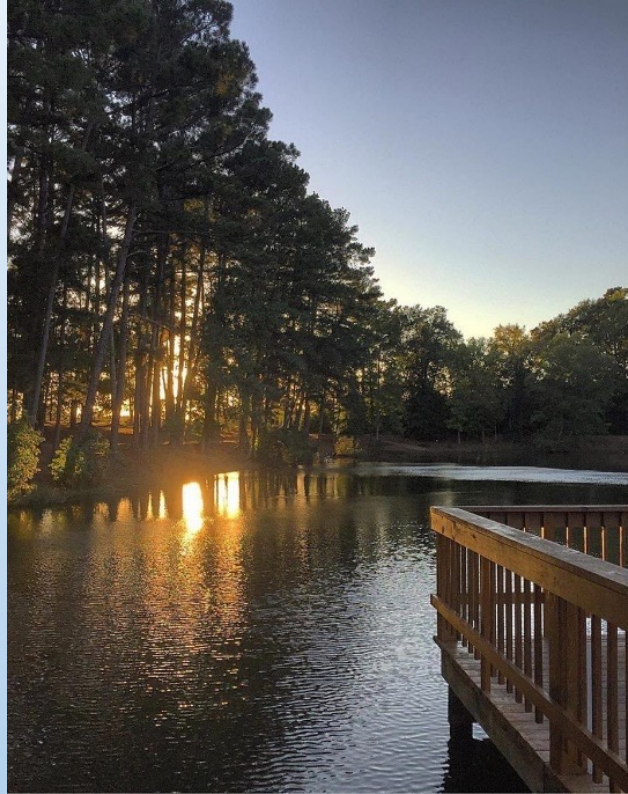
About Kilgore College

10 miles southwest of Longview (Texas), a city of 90,000.

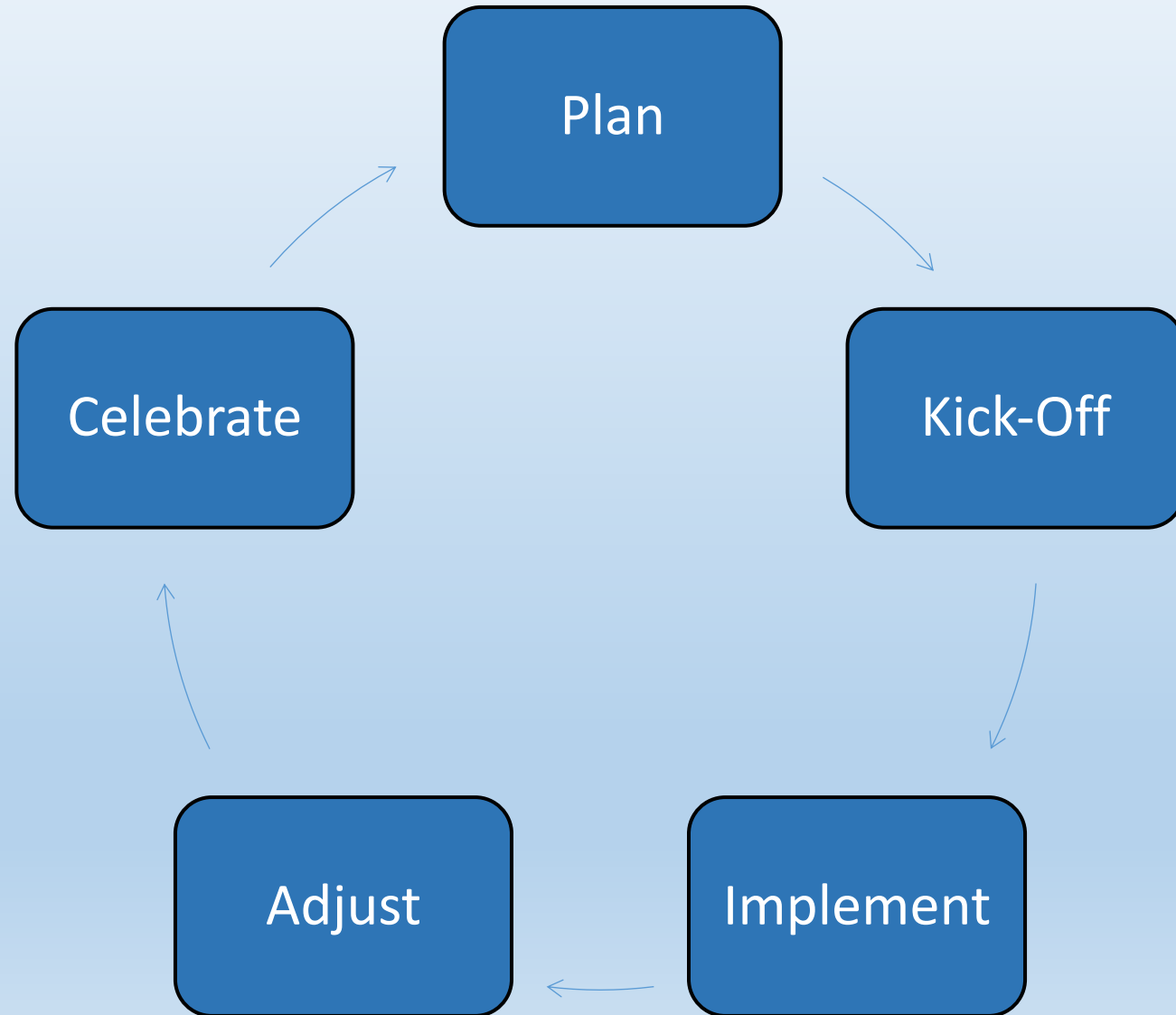




Learn more, earn more with EIGHT-WEEK CLASSES KC!

Planning: Organizational Team

- Create robust organizational team
 - All stakeholders represented
 - Marketing
 - Staff
 - Registrar
 - Financial Aid
 - Counseling/Advising
 - Faculty
 - Administration
 - Create timeline for benchmarks and completion

Planning: Working Groups

- Task Forces/Working Groups within the larger organizational team
 - Course Development
 - Created/Streamlined KC LMS orientation course
 - Standardized LMS course shell
 - More emphasis on starting courses on time
 - Student Services
 - New Student Orientation revamped to an online process
 - Adjustments to course dates, times, and types in data management system
 - Registration events revamped (from “late and early” to “Ranger Registration”)
 - Campus calendar adjustments
 - Policies, Procedures and Processes
 - Revamped KC attendance policy with added flexibility
 - Clarified and added flexibility to guidelines for offering grades of “Incomplete”
 - Revamped faculty office hours requirements
 - Marketing
 - Focus to Finish
 - Cruise for Success (success points for prizes)
 - Consistent, Clear Messaging (fliers, town halls, press releases, media)



Planning: Consistent Team and Working Group Meetings

- No lost momentum
- Organizational teams and working groups met every other week.
- Working groups reported out at organizational team meetings for feedback.
- Regular days and times

Planning: Examined and Incorporated Data

- Data from other 8-week institutions
- KC Student Success Data-Not Including Dual Credit (A,B,C)
 - Fall 2018 (16-week model) = 76%
Spring 2018 (16-week model) = 78%
 - Fall 2019 (8-week model) = 81%
Spring 2019 (8-week model) = 82%
 - Fall 2020 (8-week model) = 80%
Spring 2020 (8-week model) = 83%

- Don't water down courses. Boil them down-to the essentials.
 - Student Learning Outcomes and Core Objectives
 - “Let it Go!”



Kick Off (Build Momentum)

- Celebrate – Make it fun/exciting for students and employees
- Communicate Often – Keep it the main focus for everyone
- Share Successes and Failures – Everyone learns from both
- Next Steps – make adjustments as needed, keep moving forward

KC Successes: Getting Stakeholders on Board

- We did it!
 - The “train left the station.”
 - Everyone came on board.
 - It’s hard to argue with data.

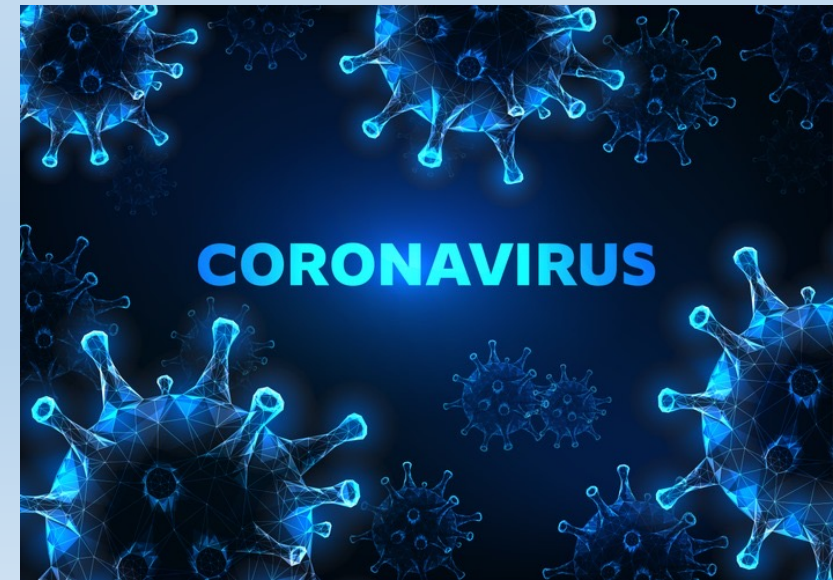


KC Successes: Co-requisite model

- This was the perfect schedule.
 - 3-hour college-level ENGL or MATH
 - 3-hour co-requisite developmental support course
 - 6 hours per 8-weeks

KC Successes: Adjusting to COVID-19 Remote Protocol

- Started fresh with a new 8-week term when we went remote
- Intensive supports and attitude of flexibility established
- Faculty and students managing fewer classes at one time



KC Successes: Comprehensive Transition

- Moved all courses to 8 week schedule
 - “Pulled off the Band-Aid”
 - Exception (courses that couldn’t transition because of accreditation requirements-e.g. Nursing with clinicals)

Lessons Learned



- Don't register for pre-requisite courses within same 16 weeks
Example: ENGL 1301 in 1st 8 week and ENGL 1302 in 2nd 8 week
- Financial aid does not allow a student to retake a course 2nd 8 weeks that was failed 1st 8 weeks
- Avoid a mixture of 8 and 16 week courses as much as possible
- For full time students, four classes works best – two 1st 8 weeks and two 2nd 8 weeks
- Students who self-register should be limited to five classes (15 to 17 hours)

Lessons Learned Continued



- Hybrid Courses will increase
- STEM Courses are challenging in 8 weeks
- Students with Financial Aid can't wait to purchase course materials
- Everything happens more often – State reporting, attendance verification, entry points, payment deadlines, etc.
