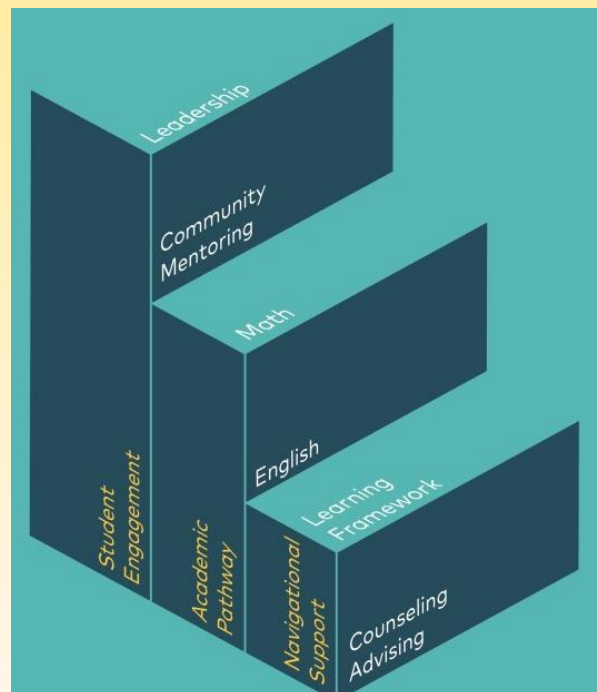


We engage faculty and staff through:

- Monthly professional development webinars
- Opportunities for publication and research

Program Model

Faculty and Staff Training Sequence

Foundational Summit (Virtual)

May 23-27, 2022

This training models strategies for active learning and student success that can be used in the classroom and in program administration. Participants will come away with teaching and organizational frameworks, theoretical foundations, action plans, and materials for program development in the Fall. This training has been adapted for virtual delivery.



2-Day Fall Seminar

October 27-28, 2022

The professional development series continues with a focus on team-building, and troubleshooting issues encountered in the first weeks of the semester, and anticipating curriculum and program development for the spring.

2-Day Spring Seminar

March 23-24, 2023

The series continues with a focus on components. Workshops address content area curriculum and best practices for integration of student services and mentoring.
