




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Pathway Success Wraparound Model Ideal Design







Success Coaches will engage Specialists when specific expertise is required through a simple, integrated process for students.





Engage

When specific expertise is needed the <u>Success Coach</u> will engage specialists. **Success Coach facilitates the engagement** to eliminate cold handoffs, student bounce and to help remove student barriers to resources.

Support

Pathway Specialists support student pathway selection and persistence on path through completion by compiling and communicating expert transfer and career-integrated degree path information and career mapping for use by students and success coaches.

Connect

Career and Transfer
Skills Development Specialists
help students explore and
develop the skills needed to
successfully transfer to a
four-year university and/or enter
the workforce. They provide soft
skills development, resume
building, career and transfer
connections, exploration,
application, and scholarship
assistance.







