








#### Average Time to Associate Degree



#### Applicable Transfer Credit Hours

This Transfer Advising Guide provides 66 college-level hours, of which 66 will transfer and apply towards the UTSA baccalaureate degree in Criminal Justice.

#### **UTSA Distinguished Transfer Scholarship**

Fall and spring transfer applicants who are transferring 24-66 credit hours and get admitted to UTSA by the <u>Distinguished Transfer Scholarship</u> priority deadline will be given automatic consideration for this scholarship valued up to \$6,000\* for up to two years or four semesters if renewal eligibility is maintained. The value is awarded on a competitive basis.

This scholarship is competitive so out-of-state and international students can receive a <u>Competitive Scholarship</u> <u>Waiver</u> and pay in-state tuition for every year they hold a competitive scholarship of at least \$1,000.












#### Impact on Student Success



- Fundamentally, our educational missions are closely intertwined and so are our student bodies. Alamo College transfer students make up more than 50% of UTSA's undergraduate transfer student population.
- The transfer compact is working. More Alamo College students are applying, enrolling and graduating from UTSA than ever before.







#### Impact on Student Success

- Over the last five years, from fall 2016 to 2020:
  - 46% increase in applications from Alamo Colleges to UTSA (1,480 to 2,160)
  - **32%** increase in **undergraduate** transfer students **enrolled** (4,587 to 6,078)
  - 30% increase in graduate students enrolled at UTSA that came from Alamo Colleges (464 to 603)

Overall, we've seen a 42% increase in number of UTSA graduates that were transfers from Alamo Colleges (1,290 to 1,831)

- When comparing Alamo College students versus our students from other transfer institutions, Alamo College students have a:
  - 5% higher one-year retention rate (88% vs 83%)
  - **10%** higher **two-year graduation rate** (25% vs 15%)
  - **6%** higher **four-year graduation rate** (69% vs 63%)









#### Impact on Student Success

- UTSA and Alamo Colleges have started two new transfer academies in Fall 2021:
  - Transfer Academy for Tomorrow's Engineers
  - Transfer Academy for Future Teachers

• Transfer academies **tighten the integration** between Alamo and UTSA. They allow Alamo students to **co-enroll** at UTSA, where they can take **courses for their major at UTSA** that are **not offered at Alamo Colleges**.

#### **Dual Admissions/Dual Enrollment**

- Alamo is largest CC transfer feeder institution
- Enables students the opportunity to align with their 4yr plan and enroll in major course requirements sooner through personalized Transfer Advising Guides (TAGs)
- Modification to current AlamoRunners and Alamo On-TRAC programs to support dual admission and enrollment to Grand Scale
- Student Records/Data Sharing Transcript, Degree Works (TAGs), SB 25 (FERPA)
- Provide students with a clear, transparent 2 yr pathway to UTSA upon entry to ACD
- Enables both ACD/UTSA to know of future course demand, growth a year or two in advance

#### High School ISD – Seamless 3 Tier Transfer System

- Possibility of degree plans feeding directly into UTSA through ECHS
- Focus on degree applicability for specific majors in ISD degree plan
- Possibility of Two Degree Completions within 6 years Associate Degree & Bachelors Degree
- Pilot targeting new ECHS programs
  - Southwest ISD example requested Health Care Administration, Cybersecurity, and/or Education
  - Currently UTSA catalog for degree is 6 years
