Institute Outcomes:

As a result of attending Texas Pathways Institute #6: **Ensuring Students Are Learning**, participants will be able to:

- Examine their practice and commitment to the **development of culturally competent teaching practices**,
- Understand how to **align program learning outcomes (PLOs)** for each program of study with the requirement for further success at the university-level and employment outcomes in high-wage and in-demand careers,
- Understand how to effectively provide students the opportunity to apply and deepen knowledge and skills through **experiential learning opportunities** which faculty intentionally embed into coursework (i.e., projects, co-ops, internships, apprenticeships, clinical placements, service learning, and study abroad),
- Re-design or refine methods to **assess whether students are mastering learning outcomes** in both academic and career and technical programs, and to address equity gaps by leveraging recent advancements in technology use, instructional innovations, and data use to support student learning,
- Initiate **systems of continuous improvement** in teaching and learning through program review, professional development, and other intentional campus efforts to scale effective methods of improving instruction.
- Develop ways to **document student’s previous learning and skills** as well as experiential learning beyond a transcript (e.g., portfolio),
- Initiate or advance conversation about the effectiveness of educational practices, **differential impacts on historically minoritized groups**, and how the college can leverage academic and career pathways to close equity gaps, and
- Produce an **action plan** to scale practices that lead to **improvement in student learning and advancement in education** from AEL, continuing education, dual credit, academic, and workforce programs through completion.
