Quinlan ISD has bused students to our Greenville Center throughout the year since 2009, paying for tuition, books and transportation. Students go through the summer and can graduate with an associate degree.

Lone Oak H.S. and Wolfe City H.S. also send students to the Greenville Center along with taking dual credit at the high school.

Clarksville ISD buses students to Paris for welding, and students can graduate with a certificate.

Royse City, Quinlan, Lone Oak, and Wolfe City send students to Greenville for Networking, Mechatronics, HVAC, and CNA. Royse City has started a P-Tech with CNA included.

TUITION

- In-District \$50/SCH or \$150 per 3-hour course compared to \$252 for regular students.
- Out-of-District \$60/SCH or \$180 per 3-hour course compared to \$402 for regular students.
- Workforce courses, where the cost of instruction is high, are charged at the regular tuition rate with scholarships available to reduce the cost.
- PJC provides a scholarship allotment to each public high school to provide one free class each semester for students on free and reduced lunch. The budget allotment for each school district is based on PIEMS data.
- Of the 30 high schools, 19 pay at least a portion of the dual credit tuition for the student.

SERVICES TO STUDENTS

Advisors are assigned to each school. PJC goes to high schools to provide TSIA testing when requested. Students have access to all services provided by the college including tutoring. A Student Success Coach goes along with the advisor to prepare a Program Map for each high school student.

UNIVERSITY PARTNERSHIPS

- Texas A&M University Commerce Seamless transfer for all university programs. Program maps are designed in partnership with university faculty, department chairs and deans. PJC faculty meet with A&M Commerce faculty every two years in a Transfer Summit. PJC teaches Developmental Math for A&M on the Commerce campus. Specialized agreements for BS-Industrial Engineering, RN to BSN, and BAAS.
- Texas A&M University Texarkana Seamless transfer for all university programs. Partner in financial aid awards for co-enrolled students. Have an office on the Paris campus to assist transfer students.
- Texas A&M University College Station 2+2 Articulation agreements in Biomedical Science and Public Health with admission as a junior if student has a GPA of 3.6 or better in the prescribed courses.
- University of Texas M. D. Anderson 2+2 Articulation agreements in clinical laboratory science, cytogenetic technology, cytotechnology, histotechnology and molecular genetic technology with admission if a 3.5 or above in the specified courses.
- Multiple additional articulation agreements with public state universities including Midwestern State,
 Stephen F. Austin, Texas Tech, UT Arlington for BSN, UT Dallas, UT Permian Basin, and UT Tyler.
