




How much did each of the following help you learn about the opportunity to take dual enrollment coursework?



































Of those aware of tutoring services, how often have you used them?












Which of the following make it difficult to take dual enrollment courses?








How do you prefer to take your dual enrollment courses?

What is your primary goal immediately after you graduate from high school?








Student Goals After Graduating High School

Elevating the Student Voice

- As part of a project on Dual Enrollment Equity Pathways (DEEP), CCRC • researchers ventured to Texas and Florida where we interviewed students at high schools and community colleges primarily serving Black, Hispanic, and low-income dual enrolled students.
- We interviewed a total of **120 students** across rural, suburban, and • metropolitan areas of Texas and Florida.
- Analyzing fieldwork summaries and transcripts of audio files, I identified • 6 recurring themes.

Students want to know how to balance the high school experience and dual enrollment

was going to do [full-time dual enrollment] program actually. I think my junior year, I was going to start junior year. But I remembered not only that I want to experience those four years in college, but I also want to experience my high school experience that I'm not going to be able to get back. I was thinking about maybe leaving school early and doing this program, and then I was like, "But I have a ton of friends that I'm not going to see again once I graduate. And I have a bunch of activities that I want to do now that I may miss out on because of this program, and clubs," just how they mentioned, "That I won't be able to be super involved in if I'm in this program." So that kind of drove me away from it. That's why I picked taking dual enrollment classes in [the high school] school rather than out of it at [the community college].

Students want a **well-informed academic advisor that** empowers them

Okay, so in my experience I want to be an ultrasound tech and there are pre-regs that I am able to take but they will not let me take them because they say the courses are too hard or something like that. And I wanted to take certain courses and they would tell me, "No you should take this course because I've had people in the past take this course" and I told them, I was like, well it's not on my degree plan. I'm not going to take something that's not on my degree plan. There's no point of it. So I still took what I wanted to take but I just don't like how they tell you that.

Students want to know **about dual enrollment options** earlier

I heard [about dual enrollment] through my guidance counselor in 10th grade. They pulled, I don't know how many students, I think it's probably probably the whole 10th grade. And it's like if you have an opportunity to dual enroll at [the community college]. And I decided to do that. I mean I didn't know that you could dual enroll in ninth or maybe even lower than ninth grade and I wish I would've known it at ninth grade because I feel like if I did, I would've been able to have my A.A. by this time. Cause right now after this semester I'll have 51 credit hours. And you need like 60 for an A.A. So I wish if I would've known by ninth grade, because by the time I would've graduated I would've had my A.A.
