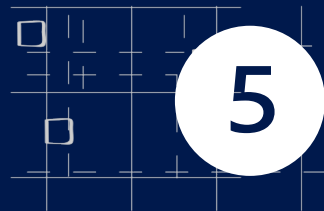

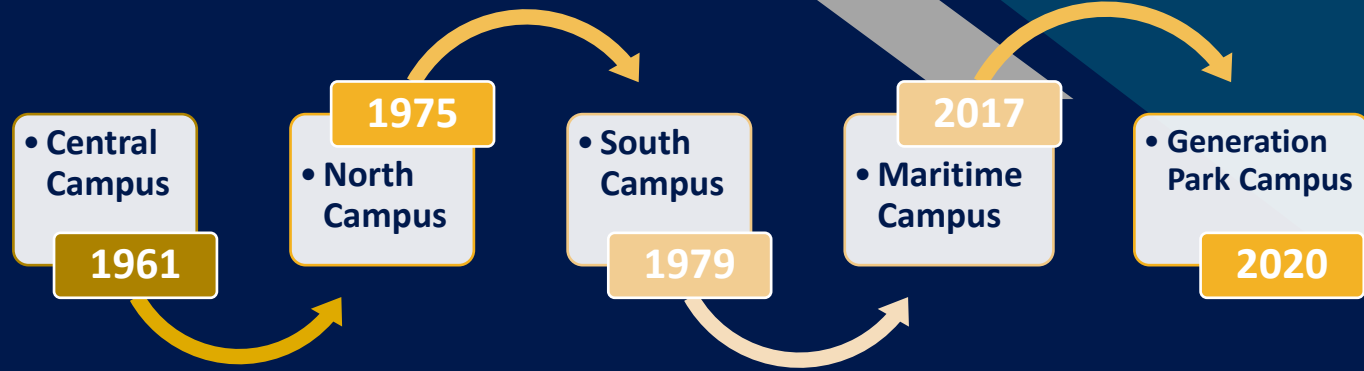

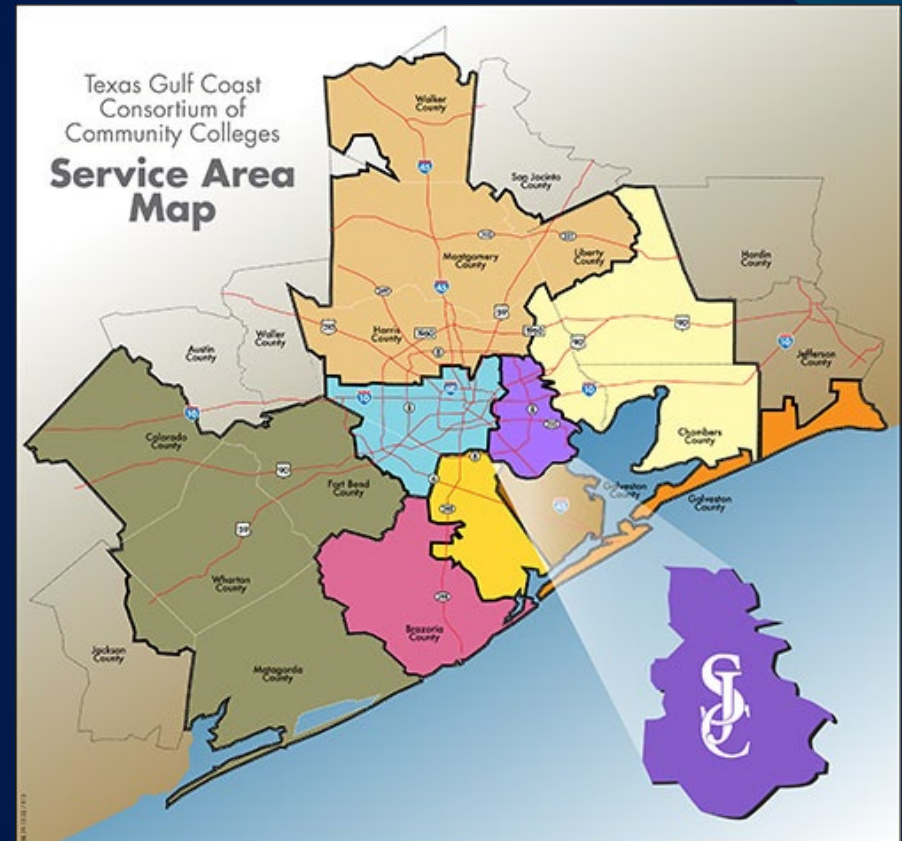

And start their career sooner, thus earning money sooner.

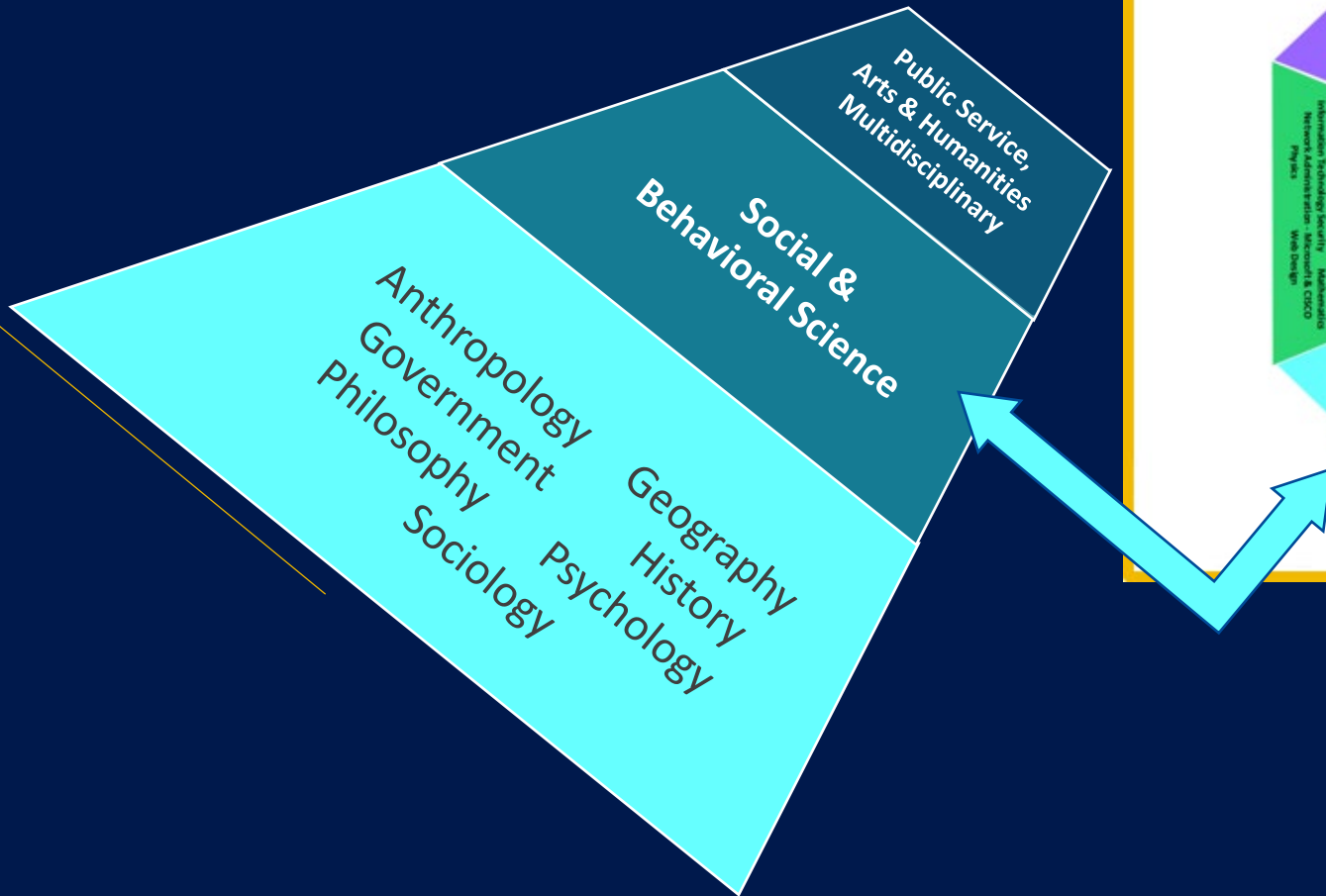

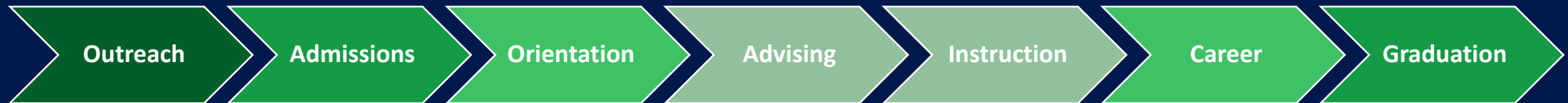

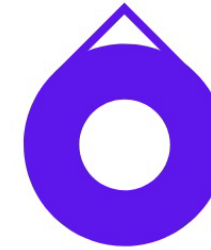

Academic Advising Syllabus Center for Advising and Career Services San Jacinto College

The purpose of the Center for Advising and Career Services is to create a collaborative learning experience that empowers students to maximize their potential while completing their educational goals.

Academic Advising is a developmental process that guides students in the clarification of their life and career goals and in the realization of these goals. It is a decision-making process by which students realize their maximum education potential through communication and ongoing conversations with their advisor. (National Academic Advising Association)

Students Learning Outcomes

As a result of your participation in Academic Advising, you will be able to:

- Formulate a degree plan to achieve your educational and career goals.
- Build a class schedule as it relates to registration for future terms of enrollment.
- Understand the general process of how to transfer to and from academic institutions outside of San Jacinto College.
- Develop and navigate a career plan.
- Learn how career assessment tools are utilized in educational and career planning.
- Understand how to locate mental health counseling, social, and community resources as needed.
- Understand the impact of college policies within the context of higher education in the achievement of educational goals.
- Understand the registration, fee payment, and drop schedule.
- Develop a general understanding of tuition costs and financial resources and responsibilities.

Student Responsibilities

Your Program Advisor expects you to:

- Understand certificate and degree requirements.
- Become knowledgeable about San Jacinto College resources, policies, and procedures.
- Check in with assigned advisor at least once each semester and participate in appropriate interventions.
- Be prepared for educational planning sessions.
- Ask questions if you do not understand an issue or have a specific concern.
- Be proactive in checking your San Jacinto College email and Blackboard.
- Check your academic standing and certificate and degree requirements at least once each semester.
- Take responsibility for your decisions and actions.
- Schedule appointments in advance/in a timely manner.

Advisor Responsibilities

You can expect your Program Advisor to:

- Communicate program and certificate and degree requirements as well as academic policies and procedures.
- Support the development of your academic, career, and personal goals.
- Assist in the development of an educational plan consistent with your academic goals.
- Provide guidance on course selection and registration.
- Demonstrate how to use advising tools (My San Jac GPS, SOS, SJC Catalog, and www.sjcd.edu).
- Provide information on campus and community resources.
- Maintain confidentiality and adhere to FERPA guidelines as appropriate.
- Stay up to date on college-wide programs, policies, and procedures.

- ### INDUSTRY-SPECIFIC CAREER FAIRS

Industry-specific career fairs are more targeted than traditional career fairs, allowing employers to meet students within their specific industry field to discuss hiring expectations and processes, their company, and employment or internship opportunities.

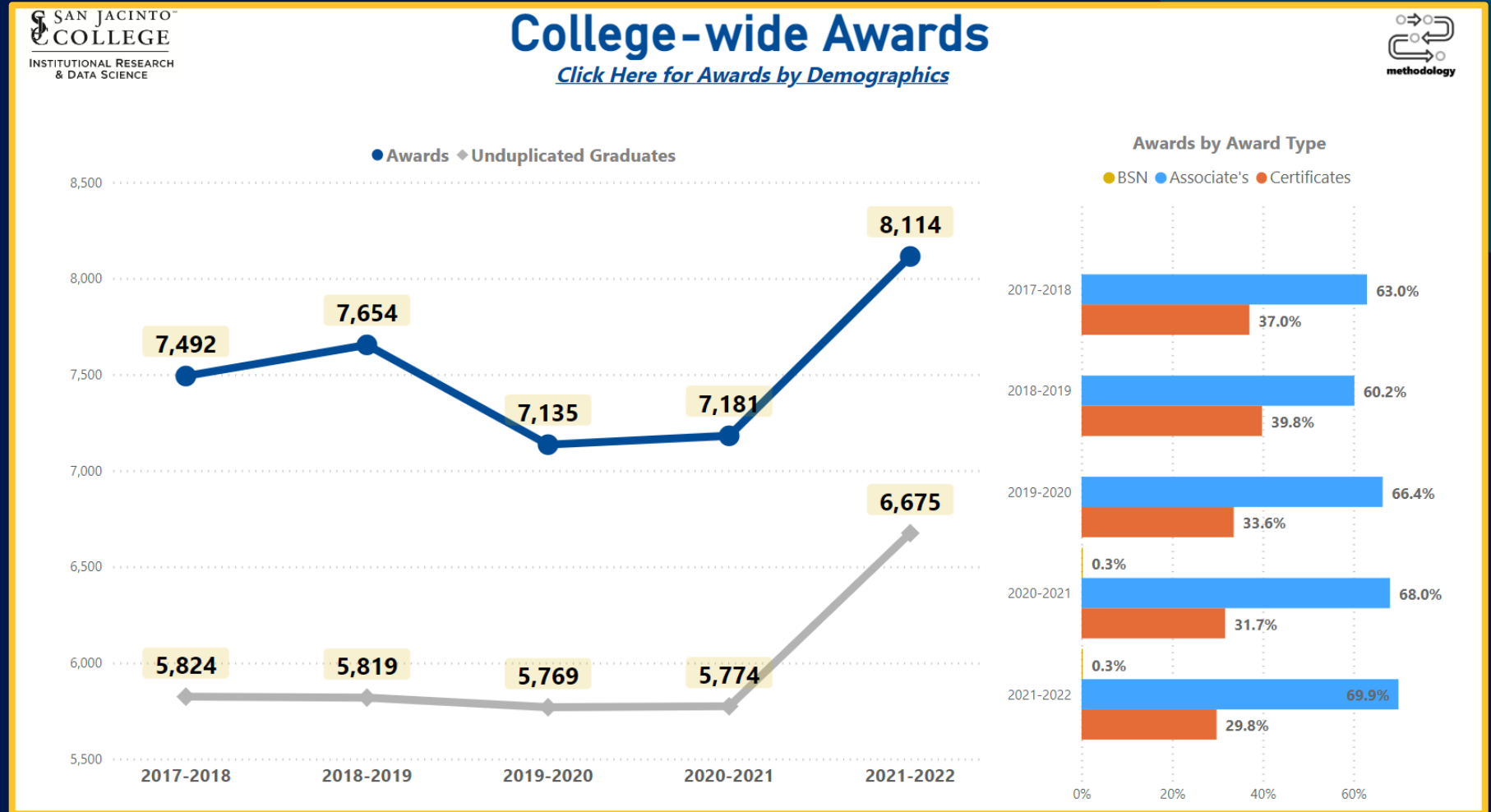

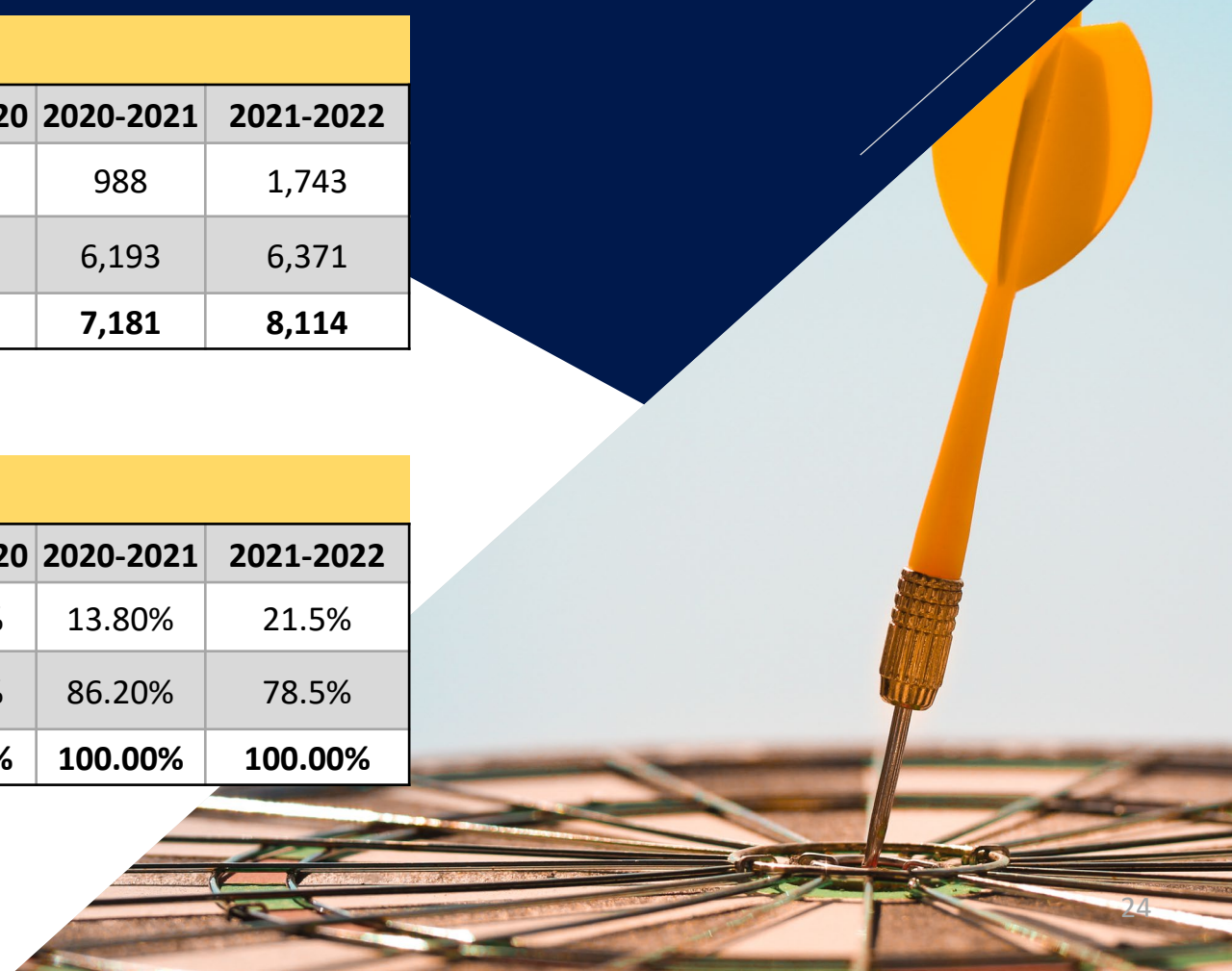

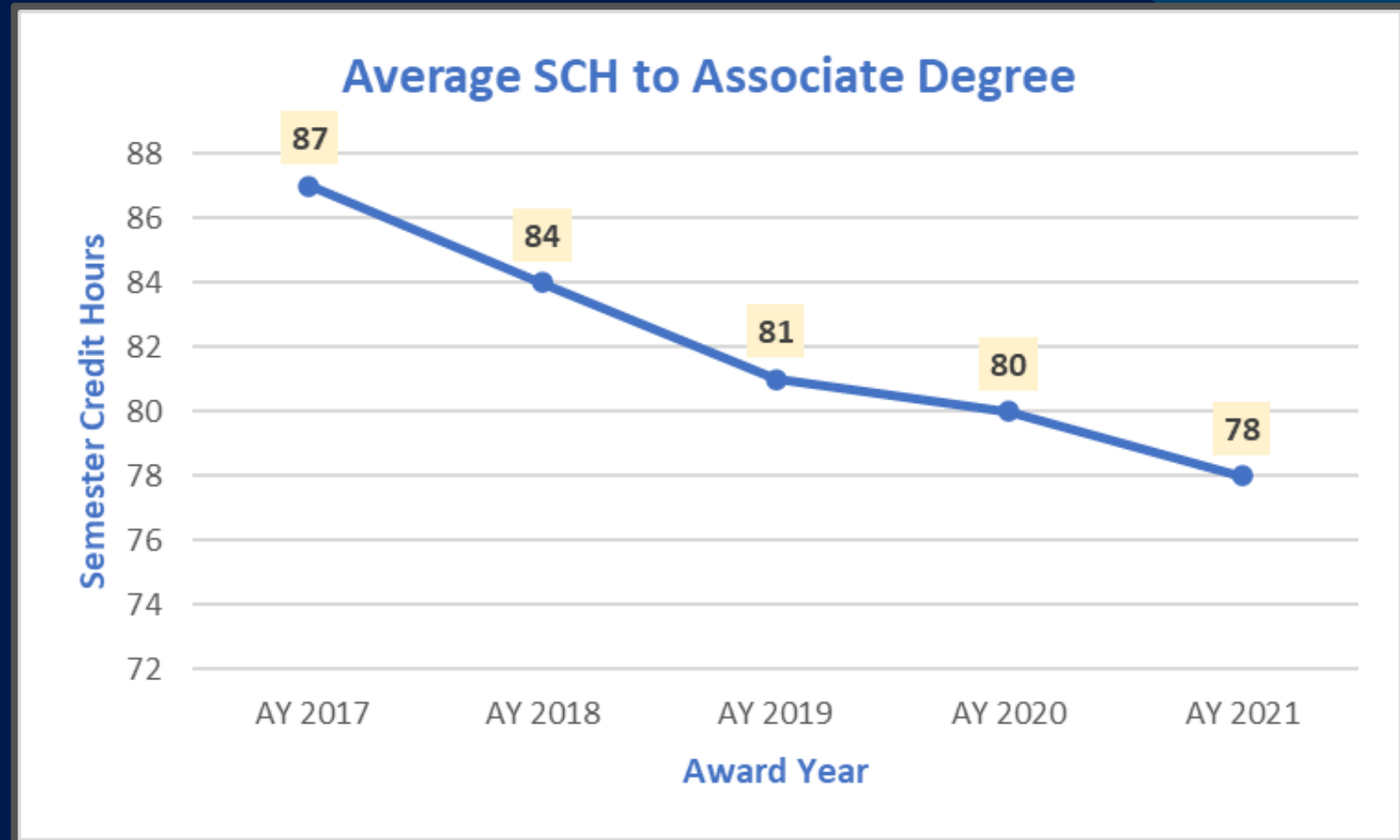
