






ODESSA COLLEGE Enrollment Trends









National Labor Market Snapshot

Sources: Bureau of Labor Statistics, Texas Workforce Commission, seasonal & other adjustments by Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas

- Nationally, the labor market has remained tight with 8.8 million unfilled positions on the last business day of November 2023.
- According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, in December 2023:
 - Employment in health care, government, professional & business services, and construction grew, adding 2.7 million jobs over the past year.
 - The U.S. unemployment rate stood at 3.7 percent.
 - Labor force participation rates declined slightly to **62.5 percent** in December.





Community Colleges Focus on Preparing the Workforce of Tomorrow



"Many of the more than 4 million jobs the state expects to add in the next 15 years will require a bachelor's degree or more. But there will also be continued need for what some call "middle-tier" workers-those with more than a high school diploma but less than a four-year college degree."





Texas Economic Outlook: Job Growth Strengthens in September

- Texas added 369,600 jobs over the year ending in December 2023
- In December, **the state again set all-time highs** with over 14.1 million people working during the month and a civilian labor force that now exceeds 15.2 million.
- Texas annualized **job growth** outpaced the nation at **3.1 percent** for 2023
- Texas job growth outpaced the U.S. across all private industry sectors. Texas firms in Trade, Transportation & Utilities, Financial Activities, IT, Trade & Transportation, Oil & Gas, Construction, Manufacturing, and other services are significantly outpacing their peers nationally.
- Job growth in 2023 has been strongest in Leisure & Hospitality, Education & Health, Construction, and Oil & Gas sectors.


- Defines clear objectives

decisions in the best interest of students and the communities across the service area. Get to know the whole story...


- Find out what data your institutions already have and use
- Know your students, community, staff, and local business needs
- Build on the personal stories you already know using both statistics and individual insights
- Rely on your college leadership to help identify statistics around critical needs and high impact practices



Student Success & Data-Informed Governance

- With the passage of House Bill 8, being a
 responsible fiscal agent is tied to student success
 and strong partnerships with business & industry
- State funding is tied directly to the key types of data we have been discussing today
 - dual credit as a fundable outcome
 - credential of value attainment, workforce and academic
 - high-demand credentials of value linked directly back to regional and state workforce demand and minimum value thresholds
