NACEP Charter November 2022



TDCA Purpose

Support dual credit programs through advocacy of best practices, research, and collaboration that promote student access and completion, program development, professional development, communication, and high-quality standards.

TDCA will provide a forum for participants to share best practices, provide training, and disseminate information regarding dual credit.

Key focus areas include:

- Disseminating the NACEP standards of quality concurrent enrollment programs
- Facilitating the interchange of ideas and issues
- Fostering cooperation among education professionals and agencies
- Fostering strong partnerships between secondary and postsecondary education institutions
- Providing opportunities for professional development
- Serving as an advocate and educator for dual credit with stakeholders and legislators



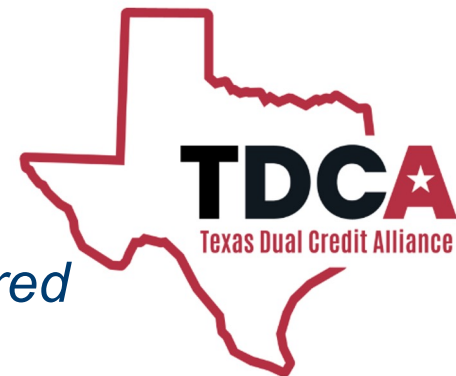
Annual Dues

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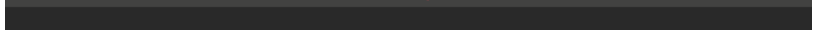
