

Dual Credit Programming Model




Open Enrollment Programs

Dual Credit National and State Data


Percentage of Community College Students in High School in 2022-23

Dual Credit: 1 in 4 Texas Community College Students in Fall 2021




Dual Credit Types of Open Enrollment Programs



Dual Credit Outcomes	15 SCH Dual Credit	Students who completed 15 semester credit hours (SCHs) of fundable dual credit or dual enrollment that meets requirements for a degree or workforce credential.
Credential Outcomes	Certificate I or II	 Level I certificate: awarded for completing a program consisting of at least 15 and no more than 42 semester credit hours Level II certificate: awarded for completing a program of at least 30 but not more than 51 semester credit hours

Financial Aid for Swift Transfer

- Public higher ed institutions that opt-in will receive an allotment
 of funding equal to the FAST tuition rate for each semester credit hour (or
 equivalent) of dual credit coursework taken by an eligible student.
- Maximum allowable tuition rate for dual credit courses is \$55
 per semester credit hour. The rate is set annually by THECB and any dual
 credit student cannot be charged more than this amount.
- IHE and public school district/charter school **must have an agreement in place** outlining how eligible students receive **access to dual credit at no cost** for the IHE to receive FAST funding.
- Students are eligible if qualified for free reduced-price lunch (FRPL) in any of the preceding four school years.
