

Fall 2022 Preliminary Enrollment Report - TACC Internal Survey

Executive Summary

In October 2021, TACC collected preliminary enrollment data from member colleges. Responses were received from 45 community colleges enabling a preliminary analysis of enrollment trends. This data is also contextualized in terms of the preliminary enrollment data shared by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) during their October IDEA Committee and Board Meetings.

Key takeaways from initial analysis:

- Based on preliminary data released by THECB, public two-year colleges are down 10.7% compared to Fall 2019. However, enrollments have started to stabilize with a 0.3% increase for Fall 2022 compared to Fall 2021.
 - Of the public two-years, community colleges are down almost 12% compared to prepandemic numbers, while seeing a 0.2% increase compared to Fall 2021.
- For our 45 member colleges who provided data, preliminary data show a similar pattern to THECB. These colleges broke even overall for Fall 2022 compared to Fall 2021. However, they are showing a larger decline, just below 14%, from Fall 2019 than THECB's data for community colleges.
 - While three member colleges show a projected increase, the remaining 42 colleges preliminary enrollment indicates a decrease for Fall 2022 compared to pre-pandemic enrollments. See Table 1 below for additional details.
- On a positive note, preliminary member data indicates that community colleges are starting to level off enrollments compared to Fall 2021 for medium and very large colleges. Additionally, our north, south, and southeast TACC regions are reporting an increase of 2,400 students overall. See Table 2 and Table 3 for additional details.
- Additional analysis of student demographics for 30 of our reporting member colleges show an increase in the share of Asian, Multi-racial**, and Caucasian enrollments compared to Fall 2019. Preliminary data also indicates a continuing upward trend in the share of female students.

Key Caveats

- Data provided regarding Fall 2022 enrollment from both THECB and TACC are based on preliminary enrollments. Trends may shift as data is certified.
- Certified data publicly available via the THECB Accountability System were used to pull and validate data for all available years and breakouts. Certified data was used in lieu of submitted data if there was a discrepancy between the data submitted to TACC and the publicly posted certified data.

TACC will publish a follow-up enrollment report when certified data are made available from THECB.

Fall 2021 Preliminary Enrollment Report- TACC Internal Survey

Executive Summary

In September 2021, TACC collected preliminary headcount enrollment data from member colleges. While not definitive, responses from 45 of 48 members are sufficient for a first-look analysis of recent enrollment trends, although important caveats should be noted (see below). Data tables are on subsequent pages.

Some key takeaways from this first-look analysis include:

- Although aggregate enrollment is still down over ten percent relative to Fall 2019, Fall 2021 statewide enrollment did increase about 1.7 percent relative to Fall 2020 (Table 1).
- In general, larger colleges have experienced greater enrollment loss relative to Fall 2019. Large colleges grew the most relative to Fall 2020, but Very Large colleges were the only group to experience an enrollment decline this semester, although two of ten Very Large colleges are not included (Table 2).
- All TACC regions except Central grew in enrollment relative to Fall 2020 (Table 3).
- Preliminary data suggest that aggregate enrollment growth in Fall 2021 is due to increased enrollments among Hispanic students, male students, and first-time part-time students. Dual credit enrollment appears to have increased slightly, although preliminary non-dual credit enrollments are not consistent with other results (Table 1).
- 23 of 45 reporting colleges experienced enrollment growth in Fall 2021 relative to Fall 2020 (Table 4).
- **Key caveats** include the lack of data for all colleges; an increase in 8-week enrollments that may result in higher enrollment later in the semester; possible inconsistencies in race/ethnicity reporting methodologies; and the preliminary, uncertified nature of the underlying data.

Variance from THECB Preliminary Enrollment

As of this writing the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) has published preliminary enrollment figures¹ for public institutions of higher that differ somewhat from the data reported here, including most notably a finding that aggregate community college enrollment decreased by about 1.45 percent in Fall 2021. A number of reasons could explain the variance, including data reported at different points in time, inclusion or exclusion of continuing education students, and use of unduplicated data in THECB's figures for multi-college districts. Definitive figures will not be available until THECB publishes certified, unduplicated enrollment data.

TACC may publish revised versions of this report if additional or revised data becomes available. TACC will publish a follow-up enrollment report when certified data are made available from THECB.

<u>Key Takeaways</u>

In the aggregate, headcount enrollment grew among all size groups except the Small colleges, where enrollment shrank by 3.8 percent from Fall '18 to Fall '19 and by 1.4 percent from Fall '17 to Fall '19, after having grown by 2.5 percent from Fall '17 to Fall '18.

Very large colleges experienced the fastest one- and two-year growth rates.

Among the TACC regions, heacount enrollment has grown in the aggregate in all regions from Fall '17 to Fall '19. From Fall '18 to Fall '19, enrollment shrank slightly in the Central and Western regions but remains above Fall '17 levels.

Growth rates have slowed significantly across regions, with only the Eastern and Southern regions experiencing faster one-year growth from Fall '18 to Fall '19 than from Fall '17 to Fall '18.


