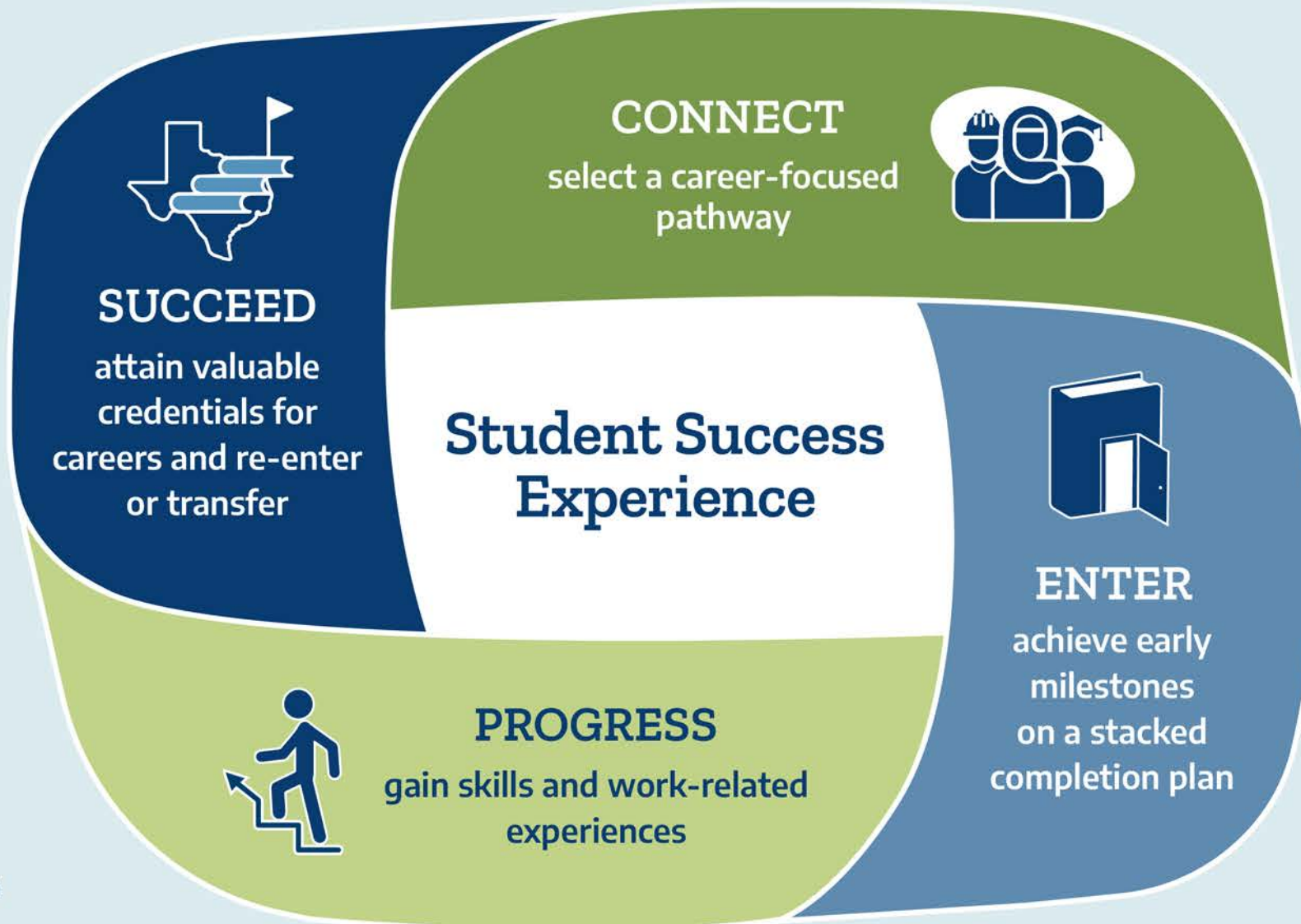

1

Map pathways to student end goals

Employer-informed maps from multiple entry & reentry points to completion, transfer, & valuable careers

2

Help students choose and enter a pathway

Career-focused onboarding with academic & social integration to promote college-level success in the 1st year

3

Keep students on their pathway

Proactive supports to improve completion & transfer, enhance belongingness, & address students' basic needs

4

Ensure students are learning

Active & work-based learning with culturally responsive teaching aligned with careers & further education

Ensure Students are Learning

4A. Program Learning Outcomes

- Program Learning Outcomes (PLOs) are aligned with student end goals AND
- PLOs are assessed for program improvement

4B. Effective Corequisite Instruction and Supports

- ALL eligible students are placed into applicable corequisite courses AND
- Support is aligned with the subject content

4C. Mandatory and Systematic Interventions

- Strategic course, program, and basic needs supports are embedded throughout each student's chosen program

4D. Effective Teaching College Wide

- Formal college-wide efforts aim to improve active and applied learning in all courses AND
- Formal college-wide efforts aim to improve active and applied learning in all meta-major or program-related foundation courses

4E. Professional Development to Support Student Wellness

- All faculty, advisors, staff, and administrators receive training to recognize student basic needs insecurities AND
- All faculty, advisors, staff, and administrators direct students to appropriate personnel and services

4F. Professional Development to Support Sense of Belonging

- The college has an annual professional development plan AND
- All faculty, advisors, staff, and administrators receive training to grow a culture of belonging

College Expectations

- Each college will identify a validated data set that provides insights from their students regarding their experiences in the classroom.
- We will utilize CCCSE's student voice data:
 - **1st Choice:** Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE)
 - **2nd Choice:** Survey of Entering Student Engagement (SENSE)
- State aggregate data will be provided to all colleges for comparison and analysis

Preparing Your Team (Guidelines provided in Advance Work Package)

- Pre-populate Team Strategy Time 1 worksheet for your team *prior* to the institute
- Share CCSSE/SENSE report with all members of the college leadership team who will attend the TSTP Institute.
- Consider opportunities to facilitate dialog identify insights and reflect on. What is your team most proud of? What questions arise? Are there challenges that you might want to explore through your Problem of Practice?

Reflection Topics

- Student sense of belonging
- Student engagement in their learning
- Mental activities and applied learning
- Knowledge, skills, and development
- Mandatory interventions
- Satisfaction in educational experience

Inventory of College-Wide Teaching and Learning Improvement Strategies

Due March 14

Develop an **inventory of college-wide teaching and learning improvement strategies** including systematically identifying, evaluating, and organizing effective approaches that address diverse student needs and enhance instructional outcomes. Each strategy should address improving a specific student learning outcome.

College Expectations

- Develop an inventory of college-wide strategies for improving teaching and learning
- Systematically identify, evaluate and organize evidence-based practices that address diverse student needs
- Each strategy should address improving a specific learning outcome
- Determine if each strategy is at scale
- Identify student outcome metric(s) used to assess the effectiveness of the strategy/practice

Guidelines for Submission (Sample Inventory Provided in Advance Work Package)

- Create a table of specific strategies and practices that the college utilizes across disciplines and departments (see sample).
- Consider differences in professional development opportunities across programs and disciplines to accurately document practices in the inventory and to understand the degree to which each practice has been scaled throughout the college.

Pillar 4 Problem of Practice

Due March 14

A **Problem of Practice** is a dilemma that you face in your work that you cannot easily solve. The dilemmas that work best are those that can be adequately described in 5 minutes or less, but are sufficiently complex to generate meaningful conversations for productive problem solving.

College Expectations

- Pathways Leads will consult with their guided pathways team and CEO to identify a Problem of Practice associated with Pillar 4.
- Pathways Leads will consult with their Pathways coach to refine the problem statement and supporting details.

Guidelines for Submission (Template Provided in Advance Work Package)

- Utilize Pillar 4 essential practices and select a specific challenge associated with supporting learners in building momentum through to credential completion and successful transition to further education and/or employment.
- Consider key actions or strategies that have already been tried at the college. What was the extent of progress made? What data elements have already been collected relating to this problem?
- Who will be responsible for sharing out the Problem at the Institute?

Optional: DEEP SOAA

Due March 21

The **Dual Enrollment Student Success Scale of Adoption Assessment** for Colleges (i.e., **DC Student Success SOAA**) provides a framework for strengthening dual credit as an on-ramp to college degree programs that prepare underserved students for well-paying, career path employment.

College Expectations

- Each college with participants attending CCRC's workshop must submit ONE (1) DC Student Success SOAA
- Pathways Leads will facilitate the completion of the DC Student Success SOAA by their college.
 - DC Student Success SOAA is designed to be completed by college staff and administrators involved in providing DC offerings.
 - Recommend the team attending CCRC's workshop collaboratively complete survey instrument.
- Assessment should include ALL dual credit students served by the college.
- Enables benchmarking of practices in current year with goal to devise ways to improve DC outcomes.

Guidelines for Submission (Survey Provided in Advance Work Package)

- Utilize CCRC's Qualtrics link to upload your completed survey instrument (editable PDF document).
- Pathways Leads to ensure that all attendees of CCRC's pre-Institute receive a copy of the survey instrument.

Dual Enrollment Student Success SOAA

Assessment Instrument:

- Designed to support efforts to SCALE evidence-based practice across the college
- Designed to reduce gaps in access and success, particularly for underservice student populations
- Informed by Texas context and what is working at exemplar Texas community colleges

Evidence-Based Components

- Outreach: DC outreach activities and the criteria your college uses to determine students' eligibility
- Alignment: Alignment of DC offerings to college degree programs and building DC coursework into high school curricula
- College Advising Practices: College and career advising and planning for DC students
- Instructional/Academic Support: Providing instructional and academic support for DC students
- Emerging practices: FAST and House Bill 8

- Benchmarking and evaluation of progress every year
- Analysis by CCRC + College/Coaches Playbook with Resources
