Re: Call for Nominations for the CCATT Board of Directors

Dear Texas Trustees & Regents:

As the Immediate Past Chair of the CCATT Board of Directors, I serve as the Chair of the Nominating Committee in connection with the election of directors at the Annual Business Meeting on September 12, 2025, during the CCATT Annual Conference in Austin, TX.

On behalf of the Nominating Committee, I invite you to consider serving all 50 community colleges in our state by seeking nomination for election to the CCATT Board of Directors. The director positions open for election are:

- I. Small College Director
- II. Medium College Director (two positions)
- III. Large College Director
- IV. Very Large College Director

Director positions are elected for two-year terms and require a minimum level of attendance with active participation in quarterly board meetings. Directors are also expected to engage meaningfully in CCATT committees and activities, including the annual conference, regional seminars, and networking receptions.

Any trustee or regent serving on the board of a Texas community college, which is a member in good standing with the Texas Association of Community Colleges (TACC), is eligible to be nominated, and current directors whose terms are expiring may seek re-election. Enclosed with this letter is a chart categorizing colleges by size, as defined by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.

In order to be on the slate at our annual meeting, you will need to submit two letters to the Nominating Committee via our CCATT Director, Nicole Eversmann at neversmann@tacc.org. If you are running for re-election, you only need to submit the first of the following. These letters must be received no later than **July 16, 2025**.

1. The first letter is a letter of your intent to seek nomination for election to become a member of the Board of Directors of CCATT. Please make sure to indicate which position you are seeking. The letter should also include information about you and your reasons for wanting to serve on the board.
2. The second is a letter signed by your college board chair supporting your nomination for the position you designated in your first letter.

After July 16, 2025, no other nominations will be accepted, and a meeting of the CCATT Nominating Committee will be held to discuss the nominees and set the slate of candidates that will be submitted for review to the CCATT Board for approval. No later than September 1, 2025, the approved slate of candidates and notice of the annual meeting will be delivered to CCATT members, according to our bylaws.

At the annual business meeting, candidates will have the opportunity to address the membership; one board member from each college that is present at the meeting will serve as a voting delegate. After candidate speeches, the delegates will cast votes for each position, with the winner being the candidate receiving a majority of votes.
