

Building Pathways to Success: Comprehensive Program Planning & Proactive Student Support

Problem Statement: Combating Extended College Time and Increase Costs with Early Program Planning

Key Findings:

1. Structured Program Planning and Advising:

- Impact:** Effective planning and guidance prevent random course selection, reducing dropout rates and frustration.
- Data:** Students with comprehensive plans have higher retention and success rates (Shafer, 2021; Jenkins et al., 2020).

2. Advising Challenges:

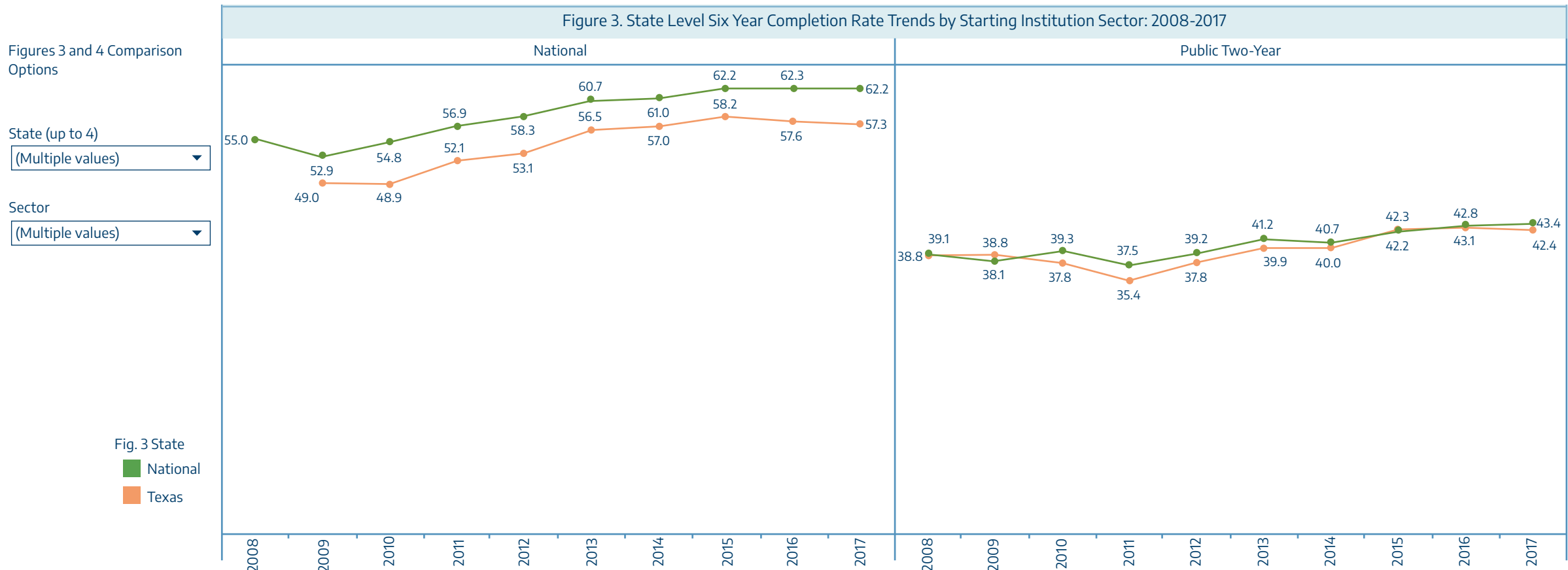
- Issue:** High demand for advising and insufficient resources impact student success (Ryan, 2020).
- Solution:** Balanced advisor-to-student ratio (200-250 students per advisor) enhances support.

3. Proactive Intervention Systems:

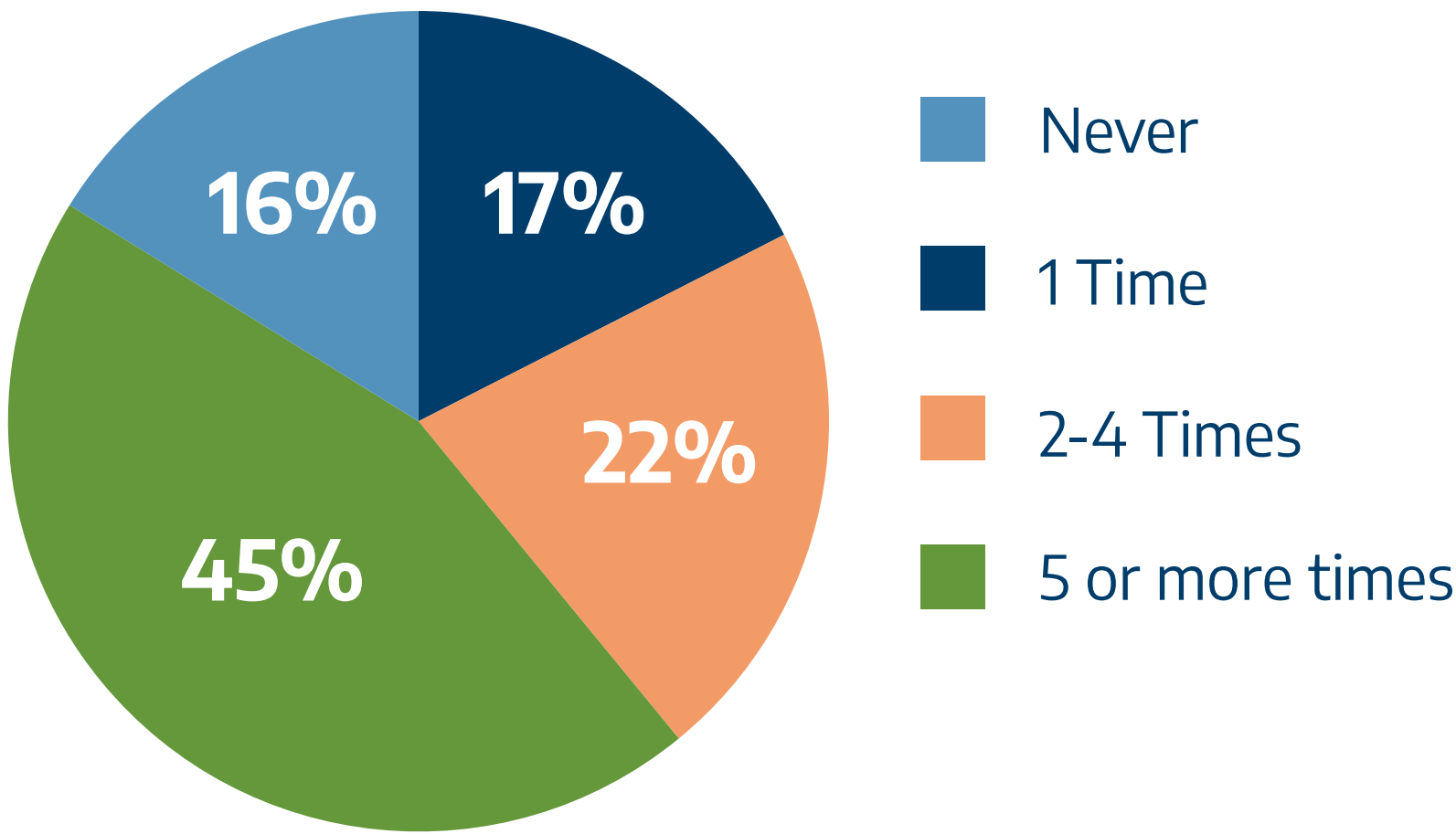
- Benefit:** Predictive Early Alert systems use data to assess student success potential, allowing timely support.
- Collaboration:** Instruction and Student Support departments work together to intervene early, build supports in services

Frequency of Utilization: Academic Advising



Proposed Changes:

1. Student Success Planning and Onboarding:

- Identify key courses for a success-ready curriculum.
- Enhance orientation with career support.
- Advisors create full program plans within the first term.

2. Enhanced Advising Services:

- Cap advisor caseloads at 200-250 students.
- Advisors create and review program plans after initial registration.

3. Predictive Early Alert:

- Implement a system to support at-risk students using data.
- Proactively intervene with timely support.
