


- Historically, appropriations have increased significantly each decade.
- Exceeding \$1 Billion in GR (BY 92-93) was an important milestone for community colleges.




- State appropriations, for the most part, have continued to increase each biennium since the 1992-93 biennium.
- The \$1.6 Billion appropriation for the current biennium is the largest appropriation community colleges have ever received.





- When the tremendous growth of community colleges is accounted for, the funding picture for community colleges looks much different.
- The current biennium's appropriation is 14.4% less than the highest level of state funding (2002-03 biennium).






The 80th Legislature: THECB Commissioner's Recommendation

Full CTC Formula	3,295,057,418
Less Tuition/Fees	1,208,345,872
Plus Inflation	248,932,580
Commissioner's Recommendation	2,335,644,126
Percent of Formula	71%

If adopted by the Legislature, the Commissioner's recommendation would add approximately \$568 million to the community college formula appropriation (total appropriation = \$2.18 Billion).




The 80th Legislature: THECB Commissioner's Recommendation




The 80th Legislature: LAR Submission - the starting point in the process

- LAR Hearing: October 2, 2006, Austin, time: TBA




The 80th Legislature: LAR Submission, 10% less than current biennium
