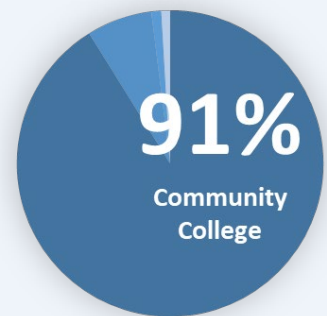

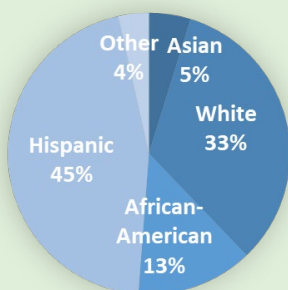

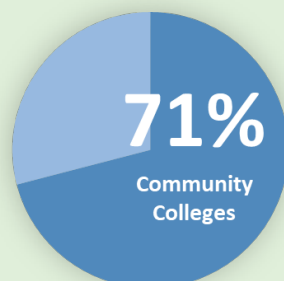

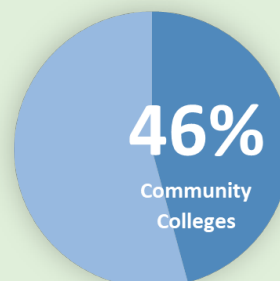

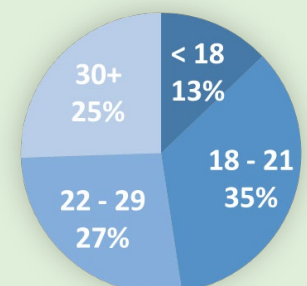

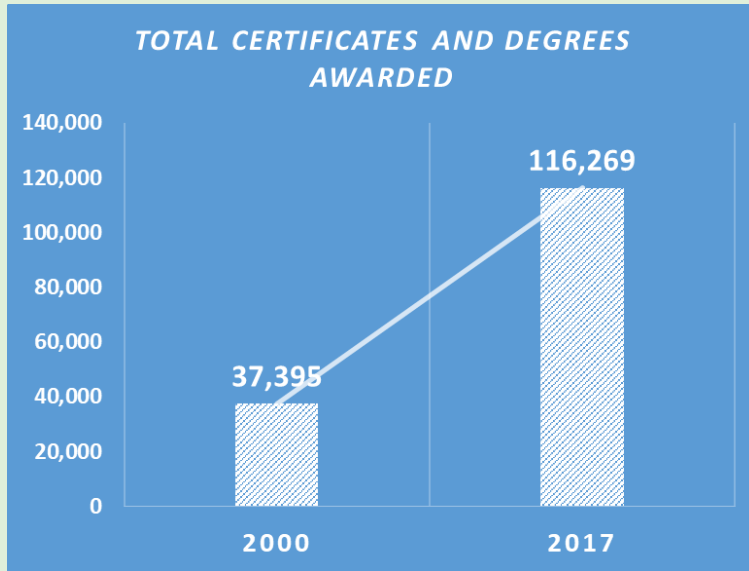

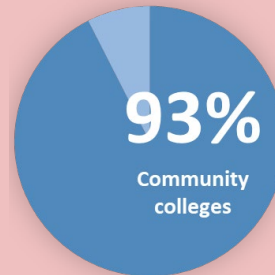

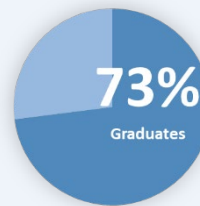

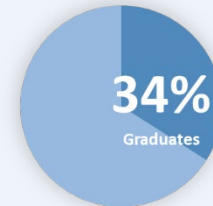


93% of all Technical Certificates & Associate Degrees Awarded in FY 2017 were at Texas community colleges (54,630 of 59,051)

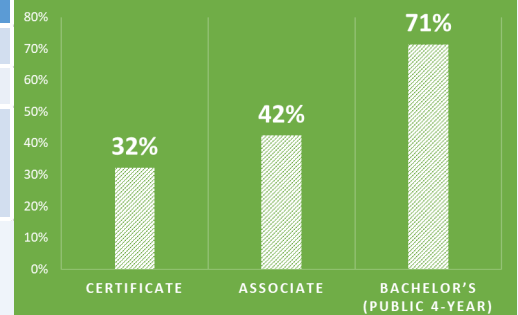
