Join us for Texas Pathways Institute #6, Ensuring Students are Learning! This institute will focus on ensuring students are learning and progressing along the pathway.

With generous support from our funders, the Texas Success Center subsidizes registration fees and two nights of hotel (4/24 & 4/25) for teams of seven from each Texas community college. **Pathways leads will be given seven complimentary registration codes to distribute to their team**. By entering this code, the registration fee will be waived and two hotel nights will be secured for that individual within our room block. Hotel confirmations will be sent by the hotel after registration closes on April 10, 2019. Colleges are responsible for all other travel expenses, including travel to and from the hotel, parking, and meals not provided at the institute.

Colleges are welcome to bring team members in addition to the seven subsidized by the Texas Success Center. For each additional team member, colleges will be charged a registration fee of \$300, payable by credit card. Additional guests may book hotel rooms within our room block at the contracted per diem rate of \$125/night plus tax by clicking the hotel link at the end of the registration process. Please note that the hotel will not accept room reservations within our block by phone. All hotel reservations must be secured during event registration.

The deadline to register for Institute #6 is Wednesday, April 10, 2019.

#### Fields of Study – Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board 10:00 AM - 1:00 PM

In this session, participants will learn about Fields of Study Curricula (FOSC) and how they work to strengthen guided pathways and transfer outcomes. FOSC were created by the Texas legislature more than a decade ago to provide a guarantee that lower-division, major specific courses would transfer and apply to the appropriate bachelor's degree. In the last two years, THECB has made FOSC a major priority and has focused on developing the top 25 highest enrollment FOSC and is actively working to support implementation and ensure compliance. The session will include some background on FOSC, what is required by law, how faculty develop them, and how to notify THECB with any issues. The session will also include interactive elements. Institutions will conduct a gap analysis comparing a selection of FOSC with institutional program maps and develop plans for internal communications to enhance knowledge of and use of FOSC. The session will also include a panel of college and university representatives who have been increasing the number of FOSC completions in recent years. They will share strategies for implementation and how they addressed challenges.

# Scale of Adoption Assessment Equity Considerations

As themes, ideas, or areas for future work emerge during your discussion, please note the ways in which equity issues connect with guided pathways implementation in "Progress to Date" and "Next Steps" as well as during follow-up conversations.

#### Equity Considerations in Area 1:

- Are the college's website and program pages easy to navigate and understand for students and families without prior experience with higher education?
- How could the college ensure that access to and use of this information is equitable for students who have been historically underrepresented and/or underserved in higher education (e.g., racial/ethnic minority students, lower-income students, first-generation students, students with disabilities, indigenous students, formerly incarcerated students, veterans, undocumented students, etc.)?
- How are financial costs, potential debt, and economic benefits of program completion (including paths to program-relevant regional employment, projected earnings, and transfer outcomes) made clear for prospective students? Do program websites clarify differences in earnings potential between related certificates and degrees and across levels of educational attainment?
