

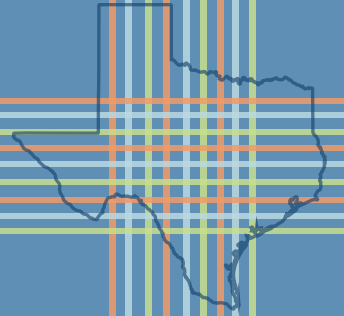

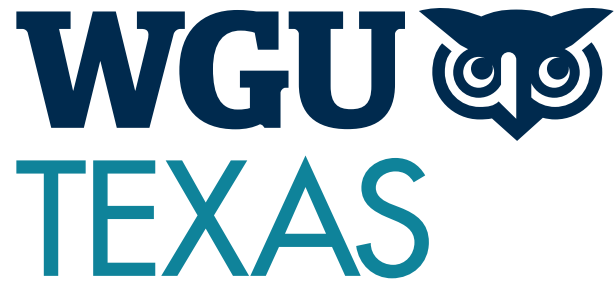

We Are Affordable *and effective*

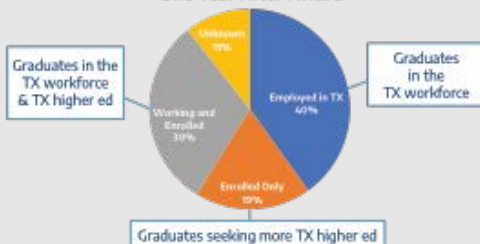
Low Debt for Texans

We have the **3rd lowest tuition** in the nation

Only one in four graduates of a Texas community college has student loan debt

Among 2016 graduates who borrowed, the median debt was about 40% of first-year wages, **lower than the state goal of 60%**

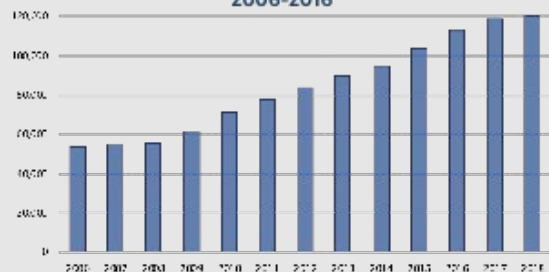
Status of 2017 TX Community College Graduates

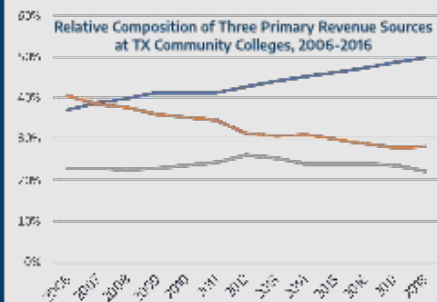

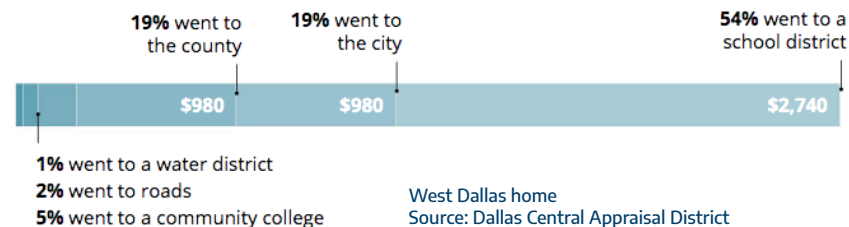

Property tax bill breakdown

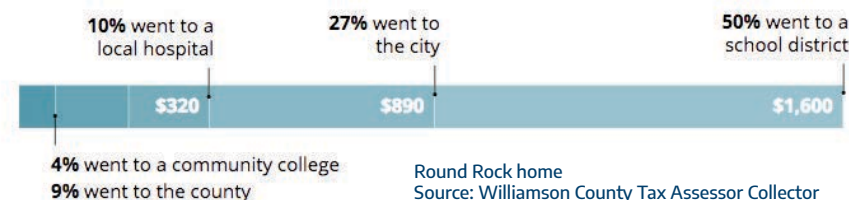
In 2018, this property was valued at \$234,700 and owed an estimated \$5,100 in property taxes. Here's where that money went.

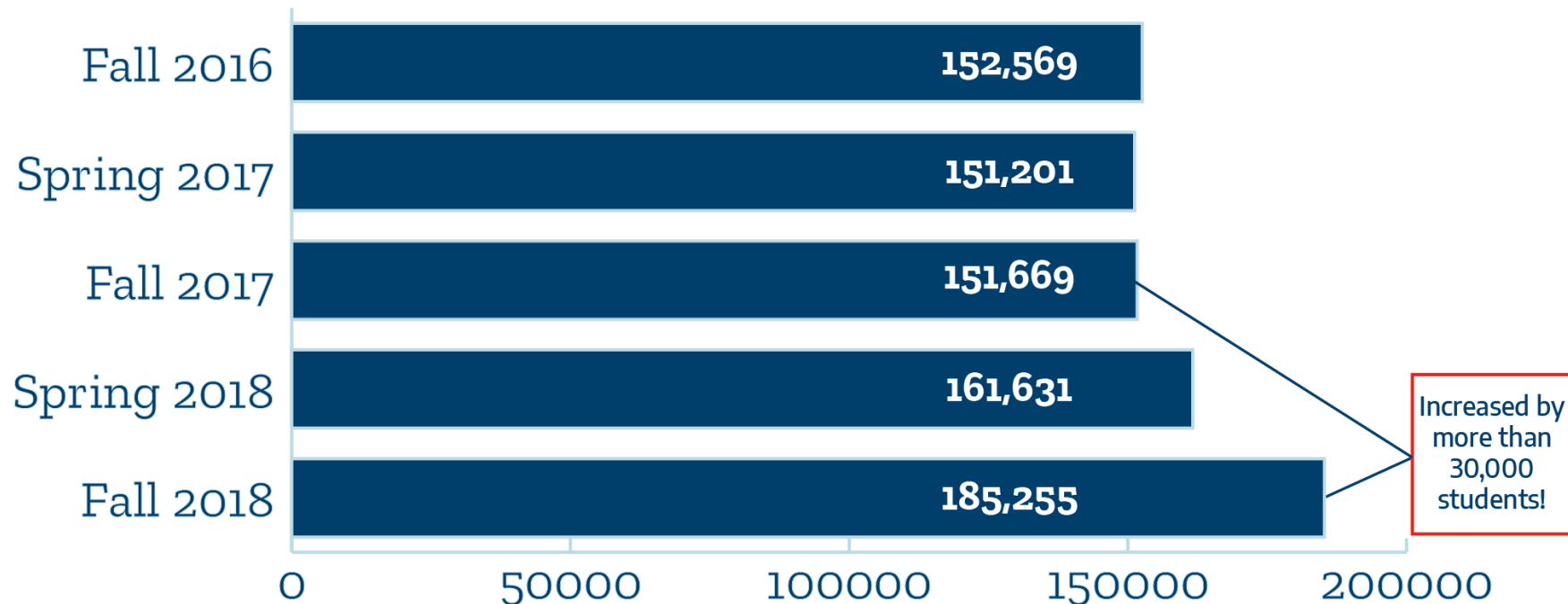

→ Improved advising will lead toward fewer lost credit hours

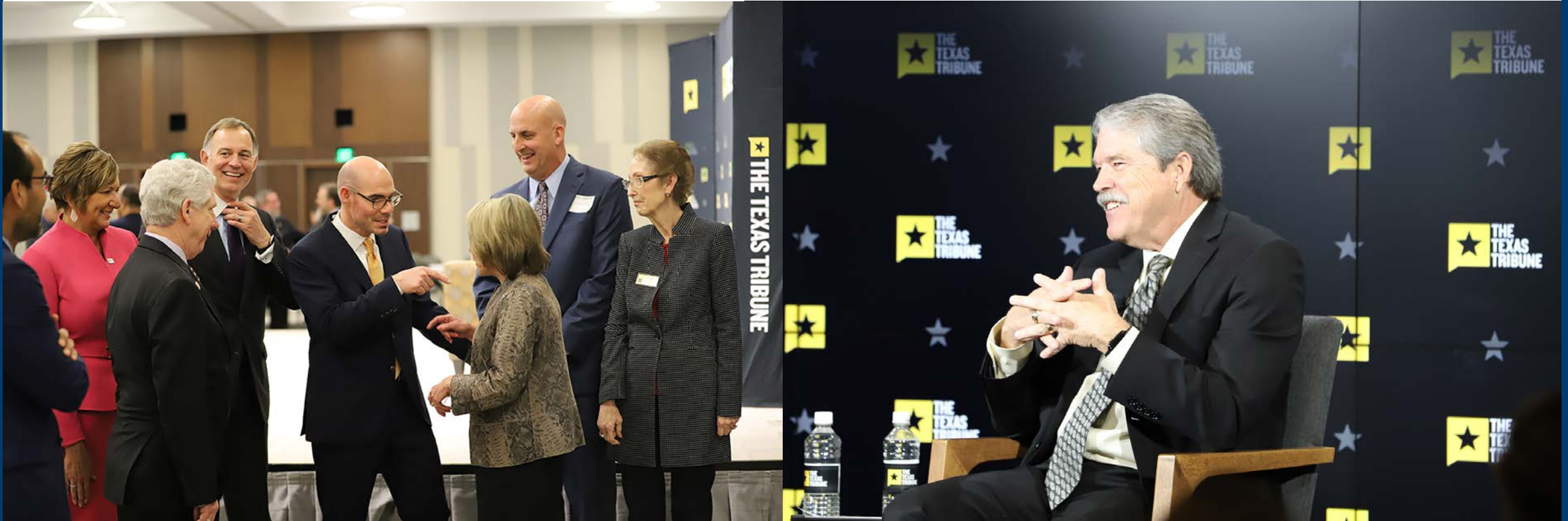


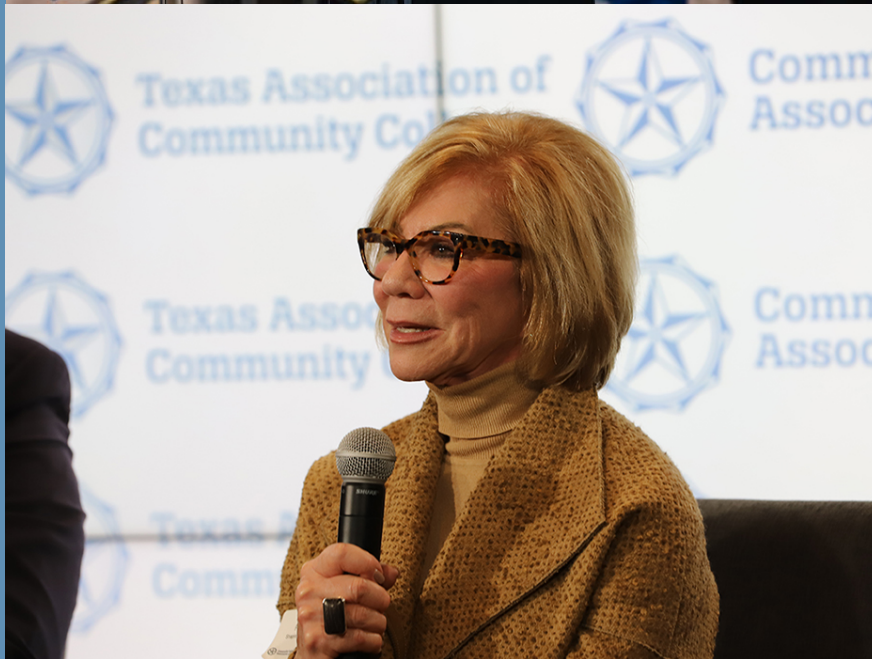
