## IMPROVING COLLEGE CREDIT TRANSFERABILITY

#### **SB 25: OMNIBUS TRANSFERABILITY BILL**



- Course Sequencing
- Reporting Requirement
- Academic Advising Triggers
- Core Curriculum/Meta-Majors
- Articulation Agreements



## SB 25 COURSE SEQUENCING

- Institutions must develop at least one course sequence for each certificate and degree program
  - Timeline for development of course sequences:
    - Certificates within 2 years
    - Degrees within 4 years
  - Specify sequence of completion
  - Must be published in the course catalog & on institution's website



## SB 25 **REPORTING REQUIREMENTS**

#### PUBLIC JUNIOR COLLEGES

- Students transferred in preceding academic year:
  - Courses attempted <u>and</u> completed
  - Semester credit hours for these courses
  - Non-core curriculum
  - Dual Credit courses

#### GENERAL ACADEMIC INSTITUTIONS

- Transfer students who aren't granted:
  - Academic credit at receiving institution
  - Credit towards the declared major at receiving institution (if major doesn't change)
- Course name/type
- Reason <u>WHY</u> academic credit was not granted



## SB 25 ACADEMIC ADVISING/DEGREE PLAN

#### **AA/BA STUDENTS:**

Degree plan filed once completed 30 hours

#### **DUAL CREDIT STUDENTS:**

- Degree plan filed no later than end of 2<sup>nd</sup> semester once they have earned 15 hours
- Top TACC priority (also a stand-alone bill)

### SB 25 **ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

#### ADVISORY COMMITTEE

- Equal number representatives from public junior colleges & general academic institutions
- Majority of members from general academic institutions with 25% or more transfers

#### THEY WILL STUDY:

- Meta Majors
- Core Curriculum
- Fields of Study

#### REPORT/RECOMMENDATIONS

Due November 1, 2020



### SB 25 ARTICULATION AGREEMENTS

- General academic institutions may extend existing articulation agreements to other lower-division institutions of higher education on request of the lowerdivision institution
- Articulation agreements may enable a transfer student to receive up to 60 semester credit hours for courses completed
- Impacts agreements signed after September 1, 2019
- Doesn't impact admission practices students would still have to apply



## OTHER TRANSFERABILITY-RELATED BILLS

- SB 1324 (TAYLOR/C.TURNER):
   DEGREE PLAN FILING
  - TACC priority
  - Require degree plans filed upon completion of 15 dual credit hours
- SB 502 (SELIGER/HOWARD):
  REPORT OF NON-TRANSFERABILITY
  - Annual report of credits not accepted
- HB 3808 (WALLE/POWELL):
   DEGREE PLAN FILING + MORE
  - Degree plan filing at 30 hours at junior colleges or general academic institutions
  - Texas WORKS off-campus internship/work study program
  - Liaison officers



## HB 3652 & HB 3650 OPEN EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES (OER)

#### HB 3652 (C.TURNER/CREIGHTON): OER STATE REPOSITORY

- Creates state OER repository searchable by course, program/field of study, marketable skills, etc.
- Includes a wide range of resources, including textbooks, course materials, assessment software
- \$250,000 was appropriated in the two-year state budget for the repository

#### HB 3650 (C.TURNER/CREIGHTON): ARTICULATION AGREEMENTS

 Requires institutions of higher education & school districts to consider use of use of OER materials in articulation agreements



## HB 449 CAMPUS SAFETY: TRANSCRIPT NOTATION

#### HB 449 (C.TURNER/WATSON): TRANSCRIPT NOTATION

- Applies to both public & private institutions
- Notation on transcript if ineligible to re-enroll (suspended or expelled) because of a serious disciplinary code of conduct violation, including:
  - Sexual assault
  - Arson
  - Terroristic Threats
- Can be removed at request of student
  - If eligible to re-enroll
  - Good cause determined by institution



### HB 1735 & SB 212 CAMPUS SAFETY: SEXUAL ASSAULT

### HB 1735 (HOWARD/WATSON): COMPREHENSIVE SEXUAL ASSAULT POLICIES

- Amending current policies
- Counseling
- Title IX Coordinator designation
- Peace officer training around trauma-informed investigations

### SB 212 (HUFFMAN/MORRISON): REPORTING SEXUAL ASSAULT

- Reporting requirements for employees
- Class B misdemeanor
- Administrative penalty for institutions
- Confidentiality standards



### HB 476 & HB 3285 **CAMPUS SAFETY: EPINEPHRINE & OVERDOSES**

### HB 476 (HOWARD/MENENDEZ): EPINEPHRINE AUTO-INJECTORS

- Law already requires personnel/volunteers authorized & trained to use auto-injectors
- This law would require information about the policy to be added to the student handbook and on the institution's website
- DSHS must maintain a record of policy & make it available to public upon request

### HB 3658 (C.TURNER/WATSON): RESIDENT ADVISOR TRAINING FOR OVERDOSES

- Requires that resident advisors (RAs) receive training on what to do in response to a drug or alcohol overdose
- Amended to HB 3285

### HB 2000 **TUITION REVENUE BONDS**

### HB 2000 (C.TURNER/WEST): TUITION REVENUE BONDS

- Last TRBs in 2015
- HB 2000: \$3.8 billion in projects new buildings and repairing existing structures
- Passed House with bipartisan support & 70+ joint-/co-authors
- Died in the Senate
