#### Byron McClenney

Byron McClenney has served 57 years in higher education, with nearly 33 years as a community college CEO, including 14 years at the Community College of Denver. During his 10-year tenure as director of Student Success Initiatives at the University of Texas at Austin, he acted as national director of leadership coaching for Achieving the Dream and founded the Texas Board of Trustees Institute in 2007. In partnership with the Association of Community College Trustees, he developed the Governance Institute for Student Success. Currently chair of the Colorado State Board for Community Colleges and Occupational Education and member of the Colorado Opportunity Scholarship Initiative, Byron remains active in higher education. He earned an Ed.D. from The University of Texas at Austin.



#### Kay McClenney

Special advisor to the president of the American Association of Community Colleges and founding director of the Center for Community College Student Engagement, Kay McClenney serves as a consultant and partner with Mc2 Consultants. For over 10 years, Kay served as vice president and chief operating officer of the Education Commission of the States.
